Scholarships Awarded by the University Scholarship Committee

Annually Funded Scholarships

AGFirst Farm Credit Bank Scholarship. For students majoring in Business Administration, Economics at WVSU with an interest in rural economic development. Special essay required.

The Arthur and Joan Weisberg Family Foundation, Inc. Scholarship – Established by Art and Joan Weisberg. Recipient is required to have a 2.5 grade point average from high school, or from his/her career at the University, and must be a resident of West Virginia.

Bayer CropScience STEM Scholarship – For students majoring in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) academic disciplines. Scholarship awards will be made to students based on academic merit and demonstrated need. Two \$1,000 awards per year.

BB&T Scholarship. For students majoring in Business Administration, Accounting, Marketing, Finance or Computer Science. Awards based on financial need, recognized merit or talent, or acknowledged potential for success.

Judge Booker T. & Gloria M. Stephens Scholarship. Awarded each year to two students from McDowell County. This will be a one-time award that may be used for tuition and other needs directly related to their enrollment.

BrickStreet Scholars – For undergraduate, full-time students seeking a baccalaureate degree. Preference shall be given to students majoring in business, computer science/information technology and mathematics. Candidates should be in good academic standing with the university or demonstrate academic merit. With new students, preference shall be given to students with a 3.0 high school GPA and a 22 ACT composite or 1020 SAT (math+reading).

Cassie's Helping Hand Scholarship – Established by Cassandra "Cassie" Marshall, class of '78. The preferred candidate is a freshman undergraduate, full-time student with a dependent/s. First preference from Detroit, MI. If a candidate is not available from Detroit, a student from Michigan will be considered. Scholarship awards will be for one academic year.

Doris W. & Brig. Gen. (Ret.) Walter F. Johnson, III Scholarship. Awarded to incoming students with financial need, recognized merit or talent, or acknowledged potential for success. Special consideration to students entering the Army Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) or students majoring in business. Minimum 3.0 GPA.

E. Gail Pitchford Scholarship. Established by E. Gail Pitchford, class of 1984. The preferred candidate must be a full time undergraduate student seeking a degree in Business Administration. The preferred candidate is a commuter student, has documented financial need and maintains at least a 2.5 grade point average.

The Huntington Bank Scholarship and Internship Awards. Awarded to students from West Virginia with significant financial need.

Joanna Parkins Craigo Scholarship. Established by Oshel B. Craigo. Recipient must be a resident of WV with a financial need and a minimum GPA of 3.0. First preference to employees of Better Foods, Inc., their spouses and children.

Judge Damon J. Keith Scholarship. Established by friends of Judge Damon J. Keith and the Skillman Foundation for students from schools in Detroit, Michigan and the surrounding area.

Judge Reggie B. Walton Scholarship. Established by The Honorable Reggie B. Walton, class of '71. Open to full-time undergraduate students from the Pittsburgh area. First preference to students from the Ringgold School District who demonstrate a financial need and/or are members of WVSU's football team. If none qualify, a student from the Pittsburgh area will be selected.

Luther & Mary Ida Vandross Expendable Scholarship. Established by the Philadelphia Foundation from the estate of the late Mary Ida Vandross. The recipients shall be in good standing, in their 3rd, 4th or 5th year of studying leading to an undergraduate degree, demonstrate financial need, and maintain a 2.5 GPA or better.

Monsanto STEM Scholarship. For a student majoring in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics (STEM) field.

Osly James Gates Scholarship - Established by Mrs. Jeannette M. Gates in memory of her husband, Osly James Gates. Awarded to a first time freshman.

Alexander Loan Review Scholarship – Patricia L. Alexander, class of 1985, for students majoring in Business Administration.

Robert F. Parker II Scholarship. Established by Mr. Robert F. Parker, II. Awarded to students from Bridge Valley Community and Technical College transferring to West Virginia State University to pursue a B.S. in Business Administration degree with a major in accounting.

Poffenbarger Foundation Scholarship – Preference for students majoring in nursing. May also be awarded to students pursuing other vocationally-related programs, including biotechnology,

applied chemistry, communications, business information systems, criminal justice, education, and graphic design.

Dr. Vincent E. & Mrs. Frances B. Reed Scholarship – Established by Dr. Vincent E. & Mrs. Frances B. Reed. Awarded annually to a student with a permanent residence outside the State of West Virginia. Recipient must be a full-time freshman, sophomore or junior with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.

The Tiffany White Scholarship. Awarded to a single parent with a minimum GPA of 2.5. Preference to an out-of-state student residing on campus and majoring in Criminal Justice.

W. Marston & Katharine B. Becker Scholarship. Open to all students, with first preference to students majoring in business. Recipients must maintain at least a 3.0 GPA and shall demonstrate potential for leadership.

Endowed Scholarships

Allan L. McVey/West Virginia Emulation Endowment. Established by the Maier Foundation. Will assist needy and deserving West Virginia students who demonstrate academic achievement and potential for success, moral character, qualities of leadership, and physical vigor.

Ann Brothers Smith Educator Award. Established by Dr. Ann C. Brothers Smith, class of 1964, and her husband, Dr. Gerald Smith. Awarded to a sophomore elementary education major for his/her sophomore and junior years. Recipient must maintain a GPA of 2.8 or higher. May be used toward tuition, fees, board or books.

Anna Harpold Endowed Scholarship - Established by Dr. Michael & Mrs. Peggy Harpold in memory of Anna Harpold. Residents of Jackson County will be given special consideration. Students must demonstrate financial need. Recipient must be pursuing a Baccalaureate Degree and maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher.

Brickstreet Endowed Scholars Fund

A total of 30 scholarships will be awarded each year to benefit students who are in good academic standing with the University. Special consideration will be given to students who meet the following criteria:

- a. are the children of parents from West Virginia who have either a PTD (permanent total disability) or have passed away from a work related injury
- b. children or grandchildren of employees or agents who have a direct appointment from BrickStreet

Campbell C. Sellers Scholarship - Established to honor Campbell C. Sellers, President Emeritus of the West Virginia State University Foundation. Recipient must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 and demonstrated leadership ability. Preference will be given non-traditional students.

Catherine L. Whittington Scholarship. Established by J. Todd Whittington through a bequest from Mrs. Whittington. First preference to students from Dunbar, WV. Award will be based on financial need and is renewable for up to four years for students who continue to make satisfactory academic progress.

Class of 1949 in memory of Charles King Price - Established by the Class of 1949 and the friends and family of Charles K. Price.

Class of 1951-Endowment Legacy Scholarship - Established by the Class of 1951. Preference to a descendent of a 1951 graduate.

Judge Phyllis H. Carter Alpha Delta Chapter, Delta Sigma Theta Endowed Scholarship. Established by Alpha Delta Chapter, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. Recipients must be a member of the Alpha Delta Chapter and a full-time student enrolled in a baccalaureate program with a minimum GPA of 2.75.

President Brian O. Hemphill Endowed Scholarship. – The candidate must be an undergraduate, full-time student seeking a degree in any field of study. The recipient must be a sophomore, junior or senior and have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher.

Financial need may be a consideration. Preference shall be given to first-generation college students. Awards will be for one academic year.

Charles H. James II Scholarship - Established by Edward L. James & Charles H. James II, the latter a former local businessman and West Virginia State College administrator. Recipient must be a business major, demonstrate financial need, and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.

Charlotte Ginestra Accounting Scholarship - Established by former accounting professor Charlotte Ginestra. Recipient must be an accounting major. Preference to a single mother.

Epps Family Endowed Scholarship - Established by Mildred D. Epps and B'Alma Epps Jones to help students who are succeeding in college, although they have physical impediments, such as impaired hearing, seeing or walking, etc. and are in need of financial assistance.

G. Bowles-Bolles Scholarship - Established in memory of Dr. G. Bowles-Bolles, clinical psychologist and civic leader. Recipient must be a West Virginia resident, and an incoming first-year student; must demonstrate financial need; and must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. Special consideration to students who have demonstrated experience in or a commitment to working with the African-American community. Renewable each semester if GPA of 2.5 is maintained.

Harrison H. Ferrell Scholarship - Established in memory of Dr. Harrison H. Ferrell, former Academic Dean. Recipient must be a four-year continuing student with a minimum GPA of 3.50.

Dr. Hazo W. Carter, Jr. Legacy Scholarship – Award is available to any full-time (12 credit hours or more) student with a junior or senior classification. Student must be a US citizen or permanent resident. Awarded to a student who resides on campus or a non-traditional student. Recipients must attain a 2.8 GPA or higher.

Heather Marie Allen Endowed Scholarship Recipient must be an undergraduate, full-time student. First preference to a student from Laurel Highlands High School in Uniontown, Pennsylvania. Second preference to a student from another high school in Fayette County, Pennsylvania. If none qualify, the scholarship may be awarded to a student from a high school in West Virginia. Recipient must be a female athlete. First preference shall be for a softball player. Second preference shall be for a basketball player. First preference to an education major. The recipient must have participated in high school athletics and sustained a level of academic success throughout high school.

Helen M. & Russell E. Allen Scholarship - Open to full-time students deemed needy and worthy and who maintain a GPA of 2.5 or better. Can be used to assist students receiving the Promise Scholarship.

Dr. Ida F. Kramer Graduate Fund - Established by Dr. Kramer, a former history professor at West Virginia State. The preferred candidate must be a full-time student seeking a degree in an accredited graduate degree program who is in good academic standing with the university or demonstrates academic merit.

Institute Plant Regional Community Scholarship - Established by the Institute Plant companies of Rhone-Poulenc AG Company, Union Carbide Corporation, FMC Corporation, and ARCO Chemical Company. Recipient must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate financial need.

Ivin Lee and Dallas Staples - Established in honor of Ivin Lee and Dallas Staples. The candidate must be a full-time student pursuing an associate or baccalaureate degree in criminal justice, have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5, possess potential for achievement, and demonstrate financial need.

J.D. Anderson Scholarship - Established in memory of J. D. Anderson, former registrar at West Virginia State. Recipient must have a minimum GPA of 2.50, with preference to a member in good standing of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, and consideration given to a member in good standing of the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority.

James M. Tilson, Sr., Scholarship in Entrepreneurial Studies - Established by James M. Tilson, Jr. The candidate must be a full-time junior or senior enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program. Recipient must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate financial need. Scholarship is renewable if funds are available and GPA of 3.0 is maintained.

For adult or commuter students pursuing a baccalaureate degree.

John L. Bess Scholarship - Established by Mr. William E. Bess, brother of John L. Bess. Recipient must have a minimum GPA of 2.5.

Kelly Miller Foundation Scholarships- Kelly Miller Foundation Scholarships will be awarded to students who are descended from those who attended, taught at or were otherwise involved with the Kelly Miller School.

Thomas and Lark Hutto Scholarship - Established by a gift from Thomas & Lark Hutto, long-term professors in the Biology and Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Safety Departments, respectively.

Lucy B. Hairston - Recipient must be a full-time student pursuing a baccalaureate degree, have a minimum GPA of 3.0, and demonstrate financial need. Consideration may be given to candidates with a minimum GPA of 2.5 and demonstrated potential for achievement.

Luel Cummings-Sutton Endowed Scholarship - Established by Roswell Sutton in honor of his wife, Luel Cummings-Sutton.

Lulu M. Johnson Scholarship - Established through a bequest from the estate of Lulu M. Johnson. Recipient must be a high school graduate from the state of Delaware, be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, a promising scholar, and must demonstrate financial need.

Macile Lee Hartley - Established by Mr. & Mrs. Frank P. Justice in honor of Macile Lee Hartley, mother-in-law of Mr. Justice. Recipient must be a full-time student pursuing a degree in the social sciences.

Dr. Margaret Anne Cyrus Mills Scholarship - Established by Dr. Margaret Anne Cyrus Mills, an alumna of West Virginia State. Recipient must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate financial need. Special consideration for students who have demonstrated experience in or a commitment to working with the African-American community. Although not a specific criteria of the award, the award is intended to recognize and support students who have shown an interest or have participated in outreach or service learning work in partnership with a faith-based organization.

Marguerite Brower Thornton Scholarship - Established by Mrs. Thornton, an alumna from Philadelphia, PA. Recipient must be a member of the Alpha Kappa Alpha sorority, demonstrate financial need and have a minimum GPA of 2.0.

Marjorie L. Johnson - Established by Federal Coal Company in memory of Marjorie L. Johnson. Recipient must be a full-time student enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program, have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate financial need. Additionally, the student must be a WV resident and a United States citizen or permanent resident. Consideration will be given to candidates with a GPA of 2.5 possessing potential for achievement.

Mary McGhee Hairston - Established in memory of Mary McGhee Hairston. Recipient must be a full-time student pursuing a baccalaureate degree, have a minimum GPA of 3.0, and demonstrate financial need. Scholarship is renewable if funds are available and GPA of 3.0 is maintained.

Mary T. Patterson Scholarship - Established through a bequest from the estate of Mary T. Patterson. Preference will be given to students from central Ohio. Recipients must maintain a 2.5 GPA.

Naomi M. Garrett Scholarship - Scholarship is awarded to a student in any major with a permanent residence outside the U.S. and who demonstrates financial need and academic ability. The award may continue for eight semesters if scholarship standards are met.

The Dr. Nyana Raynes Rowley Endowed Scholarship - Established by Dr. James Rowley in honor of his wife, Dr. Nyana Rowley. Recipient must be a full-time student pursuing a baccalaureate degree with a GPA of 3.0. Preference will be given to students majoring in elementary education.

Partners Endowed Scholarship Fund - The Partners Endowed Scholarship Fund was created to pool the resources of endowed funds that did not reach the Foundation's minimum endowment funding level. Dr. R. Charles Byers Endowed Scholarship. Established by members of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and family and friends of Dr. Byers, Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs Emeritus. The preferred candidate is an undergraduate, full time student in the sophomore, junior or senior year with demonstrated financial need and a minimum GPA of 2.5.

Richard D. & M. Alison Wolford Scholarship. Established by Richard D. & M. Alison Wolford. Students with financial need, recognized merit or talent, or acknowledged potential for success. Special consideration for single parents.

Roland Wayne Cline Scholarship - Established by Dr. and Mrs. Ross Cline in memory of Dr. Cline's brother, Roland W. Cline. Recipient must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0, be enrolled for six hours, and have significant physical disability.

Rosa Pickel Endowed Scholarship. Recipient must be a full-time student and maintain a GPA of 2.5. Student must be a West Virginia resident.

The Sarah and Pauline Maier Endowed Scholarship - Established by the Maier Foundation, Inc. Recipient must be a full-time student from West Virginia enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program. Scholarship is renewable if funds are available and upon review of the applicant's academic progress.

The Tyson Family Scholarship Fund - Recipient must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 with potential for achievement and demonstrate financial need. Scholarship is renewable if funds are available.

United Bank - Established by United Bank - Recipient must be a full-time student pursuing a baccalaureate degree in business administration with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0. Scholarship is renewable if funds are available and GPA of 3.0 is maintained.

Walter D. "Pat" Evans - Recipient must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to full-time students, with consideration given to candidates registered part-time. Scholarship is renewable if funds are available and 2.5 GPA is maintained.

The Wellington D. Swindall Book Scholarship Fund. Established from the Estate of Dr. Wellington D. Swindall by Ms. Charlotte Troup. Preference for students who have financial need; possess excellent

qualities and have an outstanding academic record; The Donor desires that when awarding this scholarship, priority should be given for students who (1) are underrepresented in the WVSU student body population or (2) have overcome obstacles such as socioeconomic or educational disadvantage or (3) are first generation in their family to attend college. May be awarded to one or more students in any given year. The scholarship may be applied to books and course supplies.

West Virginia Rehabilitation Center Foundation Endowed Scholarship. Established by the West Virginia Rehabilitation Foundation. This endowment shall only support WVSU students with a disability.

William C. Foster Endowed Scholarship. Established by Mr. John Foster in memory of his brother, William C. Foster, class of 1976. Recipient must maintain a 2.5 GPA each semester in order to retain the scholarship.

William White Endowed Scholarship - Established by friends and family of Mr. William White.

Scholarships with Recommendations from Academic Departments or Other Specific Groups

Alpha Iota Lambda - Established by Alpha Iota Lambda Chapter, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity. Recommended by Alpha Iota Lambda Fraternity.

Ann B. Smith Future Educator Scholarship. Established by Dr. Ann Brothers Smith, Class of 1964. The award should be given to an out-of-state sophomore student who has registered as an elementary education major. Recipient must have a 2.7 GPA or better. Recommended by the chair of the Education Department.

Arnett Carbis Toothman Accounting Scholarship - Recipient must be a business administration major with a field of concentration in accounting and must be a junior or senior. Recommended by the chair of the Business Administration Department.

Dr. Basudeb DasSarma Scholarship - Established to honor Dr. Basudeb DasSarma by an anonymous friend. The candidate must be a full-time chemistry major, a resident in the areas immediately surrounding the College (i.e., Institute, Dunbar, Nitro, and Cross Lanes). Recipient must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5, demonstrate financial need, and have at least two (2) letters of reference from high school instructors, counselors, or principal. May be used for tuition, fees, or books and may be extended for up to eight semesters. Recommended by the Chemistry Department.

Beta Beta Omega Chapter, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. – Established by Beta Beta Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. Recipient must be a female, have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5, and demonstrate a financial need. Members of Nu Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. will be given special consideration but does not exclude others. Can be used toward tuition, fees, board, or books. All applicants must submit applications to the Beta Beta Omega Chapter Scholarship Committee.

Cedric DuBois Lee -Established by Dr. and Mrs. Reginald Lee in memory of his brother, Cedric DuBois Lee. Recommended by Dr. & Mrs. Lee.

Dr. Charles R. Byrd Chapter of the Public Relations Society of America Scholarship - Established in memory of Dr. Byrd, a prominent Administrator of West Virginia State College. Recommended by the advisor of the Dr. Charles R. Byrd Chapter.

Faculty Restricted Scholarship – Established by faculty, staff and friends of the University. Although need may be a consideration, the primary basis of the award will be scholastic achievement. A minimum GPA of 3.5 is required. A candidate must be a sophomore, junior or senior, and pursuing a baccalaureate degree. The recipient must be registered as a full-time (12 semester hours or more) student. Recommended by the Faculty Scholarship Committee.

Gary L. Swingle Accounting Scholarship. Established by Gary L. Swingle, an alumnus of West Virginia State College. Recipient must be a junior or senior, demonstrate financial need, have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0. Scholarship is renewable, contingent on recipient maintaining a cumulative GPA of 3.0. Recommended by the Department of Accounting and Business Administration.

United Supreme Council Scholarship. Awarded at the discretion of the Vice President for Enrollment Management and Student Affairs.

A. J. & P. W Mullins Art Scholarship - Established by Rev. A. J. & Mr. Joe Mullins. Student must be pursuing a degree in art. Recommended by Mr. Joe Mullins.

Adolph P. Hamblin Scholarship - Established as a memorial to Adolph P. Hamblin, Professor of Biology. Recipient must be majoring in the natural sciences, have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. Recommended by the Biology Department.

Central Area of the Links Endowed Scholarship

Awarded to students with demonstrated financial need and a 3.0 GPA from the past semester. May be renewed if a 3.0 GPA is maintained. Recommended by the Institute Chapter, Central Area of the Links.

DasSarma Endowed Scholarship - Established by Basudeb DasSarma, Professor Emeritus of Chemistry, and Mrs. Seba DasSarma. The purpose of the award is for a summer research project by a chemistry major who is at least a sophomore. Recommended by the Chemistry Department.

The Della Brown Taylor Hardman Scholarship – Established by Andrea L. Taylor in memory of her mother, Della Brown Taylor Hardman, Ph.D., former chair of the Art Department at WVSU. Preference in scholarship awards should be given to students studying the fine arts, including art, music and literature and to students who want to pursue independent study in their field through travel to Africa, Asia or Latin America. Recommended by the College of Arts and Humanities.

Edna Thomas - Established by Edna Thomas, Class of 1945. Recipient must be a junior or senior business administration major with a minimum GPA of 2.5. Recommended by the Business Administration Department.

Faculty Endowed Scholarship – Established by faculty, staff and friends of the University. Although need may be a consideration, the primary basis of the award will be scholastic achievement. A minimum GPA of 3.5 is required. A candidate must be a sophomore, junior or senior, and pursuing a baccalaureate degree. The recipient must be registered as a full-time (12 semester hours or more) student. Recommended by the Faculty Scholarship Committee.

Dr. Barbara J. Oden Academic Scholarship - Established by faculty, staff and friends in honor of Dr. Barbara J. Oden, former Vice President for Academic Affairs. Recommended by the Faculty Scholarship Fund Committee.

General Charles C. Rogers ROTC Scholarship - Established in honor of Major General Charles C. Rogers, a WVSC alumnus and recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor. Recipient must be enrolled in the ROTC program. Recommended by the Department of Military Science.

George G. Slutsky Scholarship - Established as a memorial to George G. Slutsky, an English professor. Recipient must be a junior or senior English major with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Recommended by the English Department.

Recipient must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate potential for achievement. Recommended by Alpha Theta Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.

Herbert and Mattie Ford Study Abroad Scholarship. Established by Herbert L. Ford. A minimum of four (4) weeks to study to the continents of Africa, South America, Mexico, or the Caribbean Islands. Recommended by the representative of this scholarship.

Dr. Herta H. Jogland Endowed Scholarship. Established by Mr. W. Marshall Petty in memory of Dr. Jogland. Recipient must be majoring in the field of social sciences.
