Advanced Measure 4 (Revised)

Ability of Completers to be Hired

Starting in the Summer of 2024, the university will use GradCast, an employment information platform to help with attaining information for this reporting measure.

For 2022-2023 completers: A simple survey was sent via email to 33 persons who completed the licensure and degree programs during the 2022-2023 school year. One email was returned with an invalid address. Eleven of the 32 surveyed participated in the survey for a return rate of 33.3%.

Seventy-two point 7 percent of the respondents were completers of the Licensure Stream with the remaining 27.3 percent of respondents reporting that they had graduated from the degree program. All but one of the respondents (90.9%) had taken the Praxis exam and applied for licensure. One person reported entering the field while part-way through the program, but prior to licensure. Two additional respondents moved into administrative positions – both in a county level curriculum coach position (ZipRecruiter estimates salary at \$46,365). Several reporting applying for positions or the desire to apply once positions opened in their area. Two reported that they do not plan to apply for positions at this time.
