



Early Enrollment

Step by Step Guide – EE Application

To begin, you must access the WVSU website on your internet browser, www.wvstateu.edu



Then you need to scroll down to the popular links box and hit the Early Enrollment text. (highlighted below)



AROUND CAMPUS

Then you will be directed to the early enrollment webpage. Once on this page, you will hit the getting started a step by step guide (highlighted below)



Here you will find the requirements you need to apply and the forms that you need to complete. These are the Permission form and the FERPA form. A parent and a school designee (counselor, assistant principal, principal, or teacher) signature is required on the permission slip. For homeschool students, this is often your parent's signature.

GETTING STARTED: STEP BY STEP

STEP 1: TALK WITH YOUR HIGH SCHOOL COUNSELOR OR THE OFFICE OF ACADEMIC EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH

You should meet with your high school counselor to ensure that Early Enrollment/Dual Credit courses are right for you. If you are interested in taking a 100% online course, reach out to earlyenrollment@wvstateu.edu for any questions you might have.

STEP 2: COMPLETE THE REQUIRED PRE-APPLICATION FORMS

The following items are required to be completed and received by the Office of Academic Educational Outreach (OAEO) before any student can be admitted and enrolled in their courses. If these ARE NOT received, the student will not be permitted to be enrolled in any courses.



These two forms are required to complete your application.

Information about both forms can be found below:

- · Early Enrollment Permission Form
 - This form must be completed by the student, parent, and school designee. The school designee may be your counselor or a dual credit coordinator.
- FERPA Form
 - Information about FERPA Once a student is accepted into the college, they become

STEP 3: APPLY!

After you have the two forms completed, please scroll down to the apply area right below the two forms and hit the HERE in yellow text. (Highlighted below)

You will need the following information to complete the application and forms:

- o First, middle, and last name.
- o Date of birth
- o Student's Social Security # (this is a locked form and your information will not be shared)
- Phone number
- o Email address (one the you actually check, it can be the student's or parent/guardian's email. This is where all your initial communication will be sent).

o School graduation date (ie. 6/2028)

FERPA Form

 Information about FERPA - Once a student is accepted into the college, they become protected under the Family Educational Rights and Policy Act, also known as the Buckley Amendment, that was passed by Congress in 1974. It establishes rights for students regarding the privacy of educational records. This federal law applies to minors and adults. This means that WVSU staff cannot discuss or disclose specifics concerning any student to anyone without the FERPA form being on file with the Registrar's office. STEP 3: APPLY!

After confirming with your high school counselor that Early Enrollment/Dual Credit courses are right for you, you will need to apply to WVSU as an Early Enrollment student. The application is free, and can be completed here.

Applying is a cruicial first step in participating in the Early Enrollment/Dual Credit Program. <u>If you do not apply to WVSU</u>, we are unable to register you for courses or grant you credit.

*Please note that if you have applied as an Early Enrollment Student before, you will <u>not</u> need to apply again.


STEP 4: REVIEW YOUR ADMISSION LETTER

Once you have uploaded the two forms to your app, please hit submit. Once you have submitted your application, we will begin processing you. You do not need to do anything further. We will send you an e-mail once you are processed with your A# and WVSU email. This information is crucial for you to use. This email containing this information sometimes goes to the spam folder, so please check all inbox locations. Once you have received this information, we can enroll you in your courses and the online early enrollment courses as well.
