

# 2023-2024 Financial Aid Package

The Office of Student Financial Aid at West Virginia State University has reviewed your financial aid application and we are pleased to offer your estimated financial aid package. This email contains valuable information regarding your package and the instructions needed to access your information.

To ensure the accuracy of your package, you must submit any outside scholarship(s) and/or third-party awards that are not reflecting on your package, to the Office of Student Financial Aid.

#### 2023-2024 Financial Aid Offer Information

- If you need to accept student loans, you may choose to accept the full amount, or you can choose to accept less than the offered amount.
  - If you accept student loans and are a first-time loan borrower at WVSU, you are required to complete <u>Entrance Counseling</u> and sign a <u>Master Promissory Note</u>.
- All offered amounts are initially made for **full time enrollment** for both **fall and spring semesters**.
- Pell Grant amounts (eligible undergraduate students) shown **are full time enrollment** amounts and will be adjusted according to your actual enrollment.
- Institutional Aid amounts shown are subject to change and may be adjusted according to your actual enrollment, changes in your eligibility, and/or if additional aid resources are applied.
- We reserve the right to modify your financial aid amounts at any time due to changes in your financial eligibility as a result of any of the following:
  - Incorrect information supplied on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
  - Changes in your enrollment, residency, or degree program
  - Changes in the availability of our funds
- Financial Aid packages are not valid for students who are unable to register due to a prior bill or for students on financial aid suspension.
- All students are required to read, understand, and meet standards of <u>Satisfactory Academic Progress</u>.

# Instructions for Viewing and Submitting Your Financial Aid Offer

- 1. Login to your <u>MyState</u> account
- 2. Click on the <u>Financial Aid</u> Link
- 3. Click on the Award Offer Link: Verify the 2023-2024 Aid Year is selected
- 4. Scroll down to the Grants and scholarship section to see those awards

NOTE: The Cost of Attendance and Net Cost are not your billing amounts. The cost of attendance reflects the estimated costs used to determine financial aid eligibility. Click on the <u>Account Information Link</u> to access your actual billing information.

- 5. For Student Loan Offers
  - -Loan offers are listed below the Net Cost section
  - -Click on the Select dropdown box under the Take Action column to accept/decline any offered loans
    - -Select Accept if you want to Accept the full amount of the loan offered to you
    - -Select Decline if you want to Decline the full amount of the loan offered to you
    - -Select **Modify** if you want to Accept a portion of the loan offered to you
  - -Enter the reduced amount you want to accept for the **<u>full year</u>**, then click Ok
- 6. Once you have made your loan decisions, click the Submit. Grants do not require your acceptance.

## Instructions for Private/Alternative Loans

Private/alternative student loans are provided by banks, credit unions, and other lenders, and can help bridge the gap between the financial aid you may have already received and the total cost of attendance. The information provided <u>here</u>, will guide you through a list of loan lenders available for both undergraduate and graduate student loans, up-to-date interest rates, comparison options and the application links. You have the right to choose any lender and are not required to borrow from the list provided.

#### Self-Pay Options

If you do not wish to use financial aid, WVSU offers two payment plan options to assist students in managing their tuition expenses.

- 1. 60/40 payment option is offered through the Office of Student Accounts
  - Requires a payment of 60% of the total balance due by the tuition due date, with the remaining 40% to be paid by an established deadline.
- 2. Monthly payment option offered through Nelnet
  - To establish a monthly payment plan
