National Norm based Exams will be used for HHP 220 and HHP 440 which leads to beginning and Bronze Level NFHS Coaching Certification. Program Development Projects (2) and exams will be used in HHP 430 and the Mini-thesis Project will be used in the HHP 350 course.

Dr. Aaron Settle and Mr. Matt Bradley will be responsible for collecting the data from the courses that are taught containing the assessments. Dr. Settle will compile all data and analyze the data at the end of each semester. A continuous data table is kept and reported each year to the Director of Institutional Assessment at WVSU and every two years to the NSCA National Recognition Board.
