Some media formats are being removed from the collections, due to age and lack of equipment. The university signed a consortium agreement with several other universities last year; the number of databases increased (and the coverage/ number of journals available - upgraded in several of the databases) so the number of journals available increased this year. Additional Master degree programs have been added to the university. More staff/librarians have been hired, to maintain services.
