Higher education plays a primary role in building a thriving economy and strengthening our state's competitiveness and long-term prosperity. That is why everything that we do is focused on improving our college-going rate here in West Virginia.

We are working to arm 60 percent of the Mountain State's workforce with a formal credential beyond high school by 2030 – nearly doubling the percentage of working-age West Virginians with a postsecondary education. This effort is collaborative and involves K-12 education, business and industry partners, and higher education institutions working together to ensure that students are exposed to opportunities early and supported even before they make their postsecondary decisions. Our job is to remove barriers – both real and perceived – so that we can support our future workforce where they are and propel them forward to be successful in both today's economy and the future economy.

We have so much to celebrate in our mission to move college accessibility and affordability forward. We continue to see progress with our very successful LevelUp – high school dual enrollment – program. More than 8,000 high school students across the state are now taking dual enrollment courses and we're seeing that once they take a college course or courses, they are likely to stay enrolled in higher education.

Recently, West Virginia was also recognized by the National College Attainment Network for our increase in FAFSA completion among high school seniors. We were able to rise to 15th in the nation, with almost 50 percent of students completing the FAFSA. That was up from 17th last year. We were credited with

– and can affirm – that this was due to a “well-coordinated ecosystem of support” that includes multiple local and state partnerships.

Our WV Invests program – which offers tuition-free community college for in-demand programs – is improving graduation rates without debt. For students getting one-year certificates, since WV Invests was created, the percentage of students graduating without debt has gone from 46 percent to 64 percent. For associate degrees, the percentage of students graduating without debt has gone from 44 percent to 56 percent. And those numbers continue to increase year after year.

We also understand that the traditional higher education model is not for everyone and West Virginia is on the national forefront of microcredentialing – expanding access to stackable, skills-based credentials that help students meet their local workforce needs. These short, focused learning experiences give adults valuable, job-ready competencies that can be applied immediately in the workforce.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS

LAUNCH OF STATEWIDE STAND PROGRAM, SUPPORTING SKILLED TRADE WORKERS

With support from the legislature in 2025, we launched the STAND program in fall 2025. The STAND Program enables West Virginia residents, who are in an apprenticeship or are a journey worker, to complete the courses necessary to receive an associate degree. This path means that eligible West Virginians can go from apprenticeship to degree, tuition-free, at participating community colleges. With more than 150 applications to date, we look forward to watching this program's continued growth.

HIGH SCHOOL DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM GROWTH

The state's dual enrollment initiative, LevelUpWV, continues to expand access to higher education for high school students. West Virginia's public community and technical colleges and four-year institutions are offering courses in certain designated career pathways for free to help meet workforce demands. The dual enrollment program grew by more than 12 percent since fall 2024, with more than 8,000 high school students across the state now taking dual enrollment courses through LevelUpWV.

MORE THAN 70 HIGH SCHOOLS RECOGNIZED FOR EFFORTS TO HELP STUDENTS PLAN FOR COLLEGE

More than 70 West Virginia high schools were recognized for their efforts to help students plan for college. This shows incredible growth over last year's 42 high school champions.

2024-25 Aggregated Impact

- Over 70 high schools recognized statewide as CFWV College Access and Success Champions
- Double-digit FAFSA completion increases achieved by dozens of Champion schools
- FAFSA completion gains of more than 20 percentage points at multiple schools
- Several schools exceeded 70 percent FAFSA completion, with some surpassing 90 percent
- 5,550 college applications submitted during College Application & Exploration Week (CAEW) at Champion schools
- 3,395 students submitted at least one college application during CAEW
- Over 36,000 students across grades 9–12 engaged through CAEW activities
- 1,247 parents and guardians participated in CAEW and College Decision Day events
- Widespread College Decision Day participation, with many schools reporting near-universal senior involvement

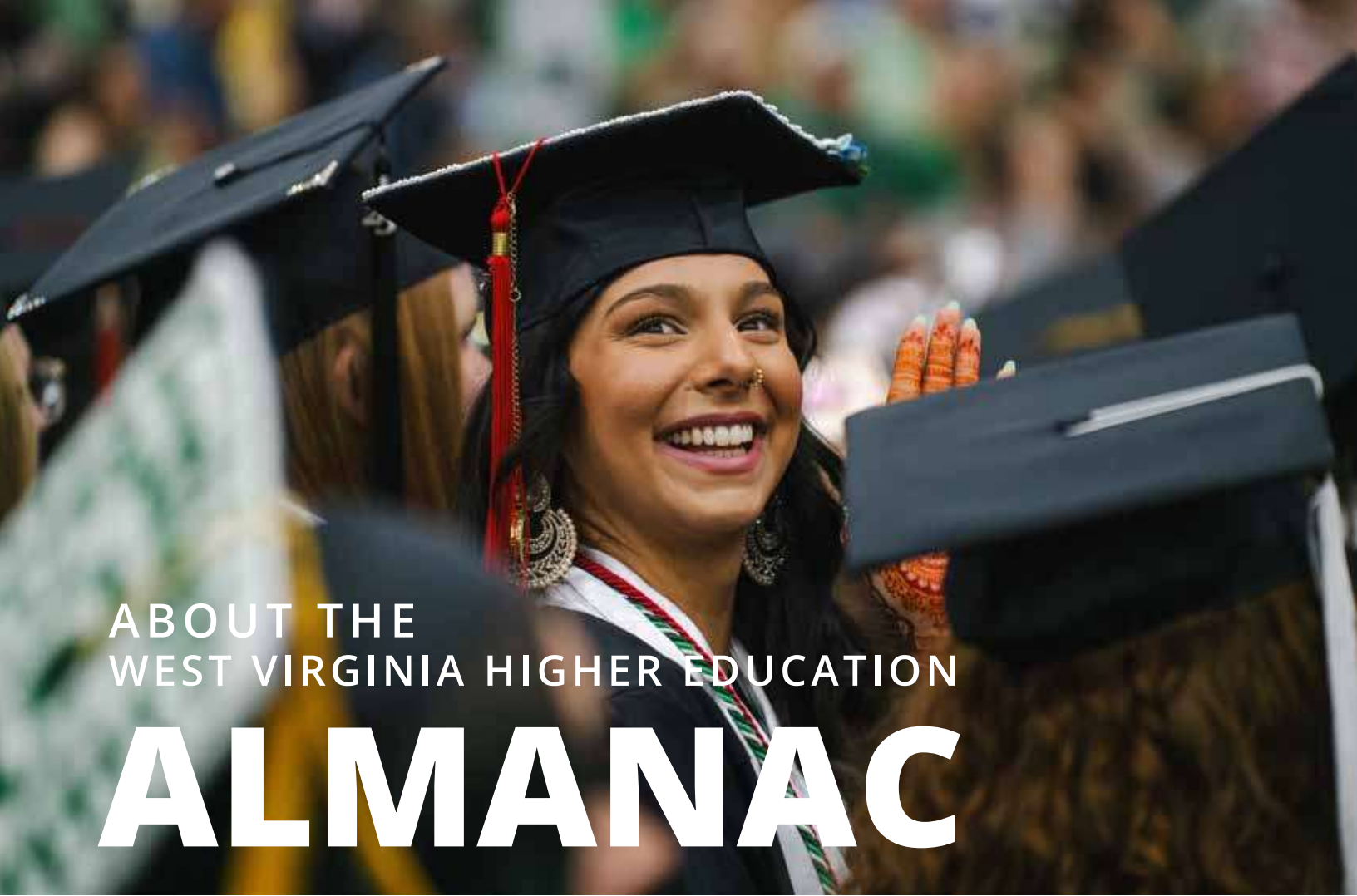

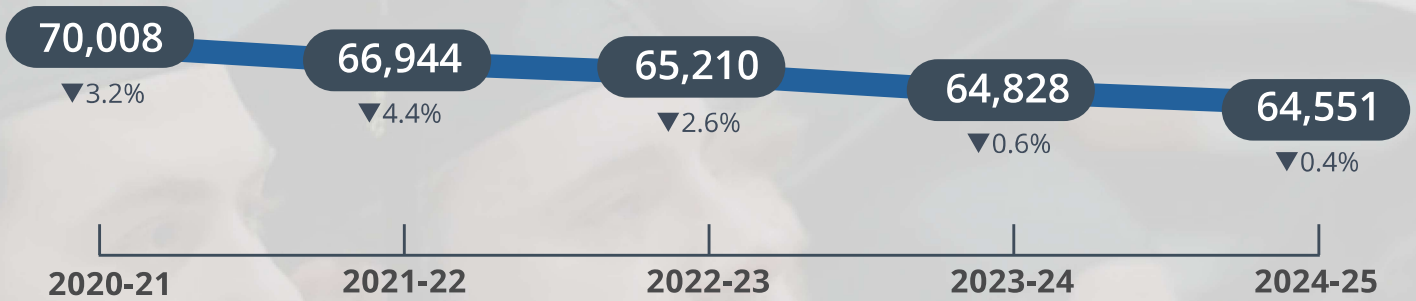

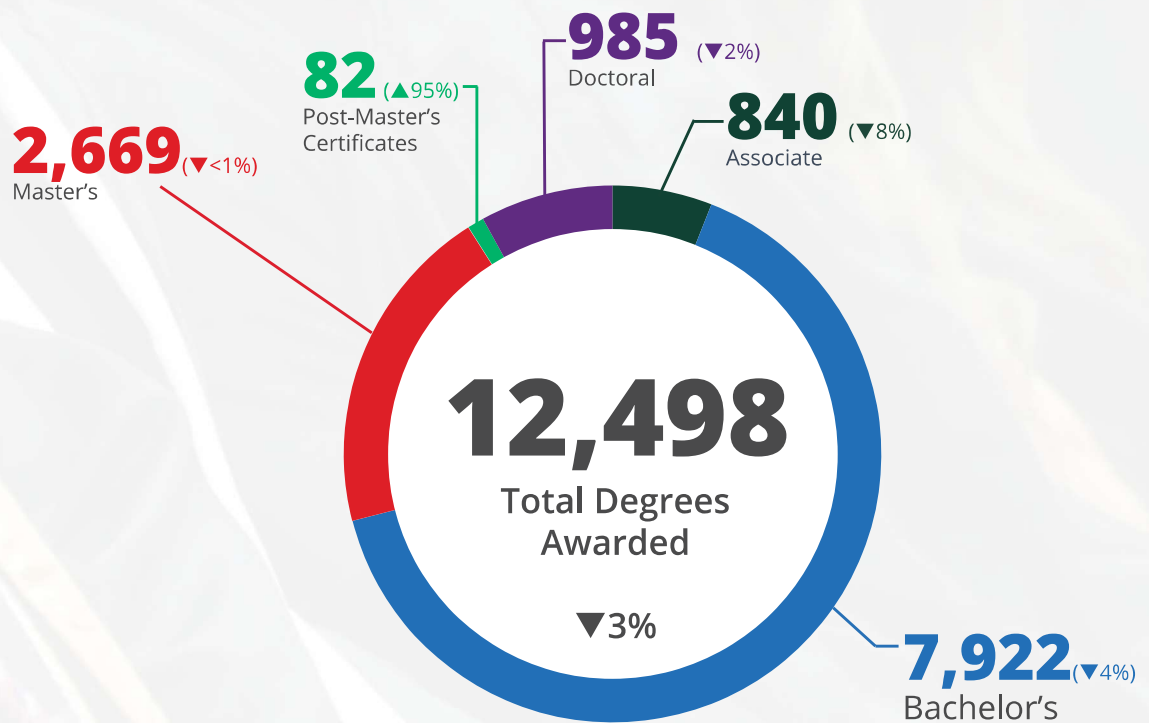

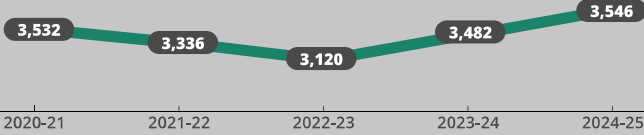

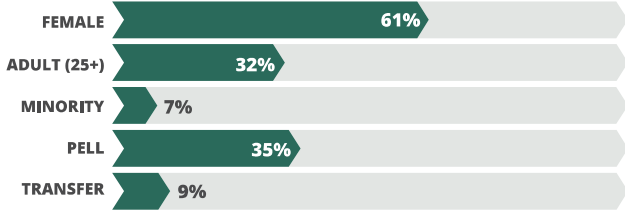

Fields of study are categorized using the U.S. Department of Education's Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) codes and associated disciplines.

STUDENT TO FACULTY RATIO

2023-24 Academic Year | Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS)

This metric is calculated by dividing total full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment for students not enrolled in graduate or professional programs by total FTE for instructional staff not teaching in graduate or professional programs.

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled in the spring semester of the same academic year at the same institution.

FRESHMEN COMPLETING 30 HOURS

Fall 2024 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who successfully completed 30 credit hours by the end of the following summer.

BACHELOR'S GRADUATION RATES (FOUR- AND SIX-YEAR)

Fall 2019 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time bachelor's degree-seeking freshmen in a fall entry cohort who earned a bachelor's degree at any public West Virginia institution within four and six years of initial enrollment.

DEGREES AWARDED

2024-25 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

These values represent the total number of academic credentials at the certificate, associate, bachelor's, master's, post-master's certificate, and doctoral levels awarded by an institution within an academic year. Students earning multiple credentials within an academic year are counted more than once.

GRADUATING CLASS PROFILE

2024-25 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all bachelor's degree recipients within an academic year. The values for Potomac State College of WVU reflect associate degree earners. Gender, minority status and West Virginia residency status reflect all graduates.
