POLICY AND PROCEDURES

GOVERNING THE CERTIFICATION OF JOBS CURRENTLY HELD BY STUDENTS AS COOPERATIVE EDUCATION PLACEMENTS AT WEST VIRGINIA STATE UNIVERSITY

POLICY

For a position held by a student to be certified as a Cooperative Education placement, and therefore to be eligible for the awarding of university credit, the following criteria must be met:

- 1. The student must satisfy all program admission requirements.
- 2. The student must complete the application process.
- 3. The employer must meet each of the criteria for employer participation.
- 4. The position must be directly related to the student's academic study or career goals.
- 5. New skills and knowledge to be acquired by the student during the period of the Cooperative Education placement must be identified.

PROCEDURES

- The student should review the program admission requirements to insure that he/she satisfies all requirements. If the student meets the requirements, he/she should initiate application procedures.
- 2. The student should make arrangements to discuss with his/her employer the goals of the program and the information outlined in the Co-op Student Handbook.
- 3. If the employer indicates a willingness to participate, the student should contact the Office of Career Services so that arrangements can be made to visit the employer. The purpose of this visit is to: (1) advise the employer of what is required in a placement and to give them the Employer and Supervisor Handbooks; and (2) determine the applicability of the student's proposed work assignment to his/her academic program and the "NEW" learning.
- 4. After meeting with the employer, the Office of Career Services will advise both the student and the employer whether the proposed Co-op placement has been approved.
